A letter from our CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters of Keys to Change,

A new name, a new brand, a new atmosphere at Key Campus - Fiscal Year 2025 held a lot of refreshing newness. It also brought a slow ramp down of critical shelter and outreach programming leaving us with less indoor capacity and fewer staff to engage with unsheltered people across Maricopa County.

The ebb and flow of demand to provide client-centered services to each and every homeless person is not new to us. It is emotional and personal, the work we do as a nonprofit to serve the unhoused.

At the end of a fiscal year, it's important for us to pause and reflect on the totality of our efforts. Juli and Peggy | Key Clients

When you hit rock bottom, you hit rock bottom hard. That's where I was when I came to Key Campus. And I lucked out. I got in good with some really good people who watched over me. Eventually, I was able to watch over others. Now Peggy and I take care of everything together. We take care of each other. Like it was meant to be." - Juli

The staff at Key Campus really helped us out a lot. Aimee from the Welcome Center is a sweetheart. She referred me to Respiro, and that's where I met Juli. Juli and I became fast friends, and now we're family. I didn't really have that growing up. If it wasn't for the people and services at Key Campus, who knows where Juli and I would be right now. I fear we would not be here." - Peggy

Juli and Peggy finish each other's sentences—playful interruptions, affectionate corrections, and plenty of laughter. But their friendship didn't begin with laughter. In fact, it began when they were both at a low point: at a homeless shelter at Key Campus. "It's very scary out there," admits Peggy. "Especially for women," adds Juli. For Peggy and Juli, Keys to Change's Respiro Shelter provided a calm, hopeful space in the midst of the chaos and despair of unsheltered homelessness.

For months, they worked with staff on benefits applications, housing applications, budgeting, medical treatment plans, and more. When Peggy's housing voucher came available while Juli was still on the waitlist, it seemed like a no-brainer to become roommates. Two years later, they can reflect on their time at Key Campus with fondness and a sense of relief. These days, you'll catch them spending quiet nights at home, and preparing home-cooked meals together. Thank you, Juli and Peggy for sharing your story, and for taking such good care of one another!

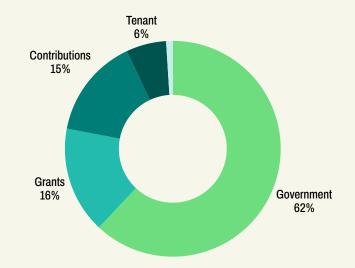

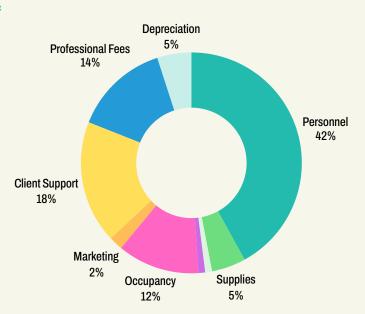

Keys to Change managed a break-even year thanks to increased fundraising and contract reimbursements. The team also properly managed expenses, keeping them below budget. The majority of expenses remain the same: 1) Personnel (of which 80% is direct program personnel), and 2) Direct Client Support such as rental assistance, move-in fees, eviction prevention assistance, and diversion.

The operating budget has fluctuated significantly over the last five years due to millions of dollars of ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funds which allowed us to shelter and house thousands of individuals during the pandemic. It was an honor to serve the community in this way. We anticipate a steadier operating budget moving forward, and, as always, will answer the call to lead the community in efforts to serve the unhoused.

The Arizona Pet Project

Provided 333 service animals with veterinary services, and vaccinated 180 animals.

Andre House

Served 163,433 meals, provided 6,000 showers, and 1,200 loads of guest laundry.

Brighter Way Dental Center

3,302 adults received 31,039 oral health services, including 7,078 to veterans.

Central Arizona Shelter Services

Provided shelter to 3,318 individuals with 257 exits to permanent housing.

Community Bridges, Inc.

Provided behavioral health and substance abuse services to 390 individuals, and diversion and housing services for 2,190 individuals.

Circle the City

Provided medical, behavioral, and psychological health services, and physical therapy for 3,310 individuals. Provided respite care for 272 individuals.

Arizona Department of Economic Security

Completed 21,177 client visits for assistance with benefits and medical eligibility, connecting individuals with State benefits and SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) cards.

Elaine Transportation

Provided a total of 9,044 rides to 2,471 unduplicated individuals to locations focused on the Social Determinants of Health.

Homeless ID Project

Assisted nearly 18,000 clients with documents needed for employment and housing. Provided 10,000 AZ State IDs and supported 4,000 clients in receiving their birth certificates (all 50 states!).

Maricopa County Homeless Court

Helped 226 clients move closer to housing by resolving \$160,059 in fines and 28,664 community service hours.

St. Vincent de Paul

Served 410,663 meals to clients, and housed 25 individuals through the Campus Workforce Opportunities program.



Keys to Change is the lead organization for Key Campus, a 13-acre, one-stop campus offering wrap-around solutions for those experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County. Partner organizations provide a variety of efforts across prevention, intervention, and housing.

Keys to Change is continually grateful to our partners, some who have been on Campus since it opened in 2005. Each service offered is a necessary step to housing for clients.

Together, solving the housing crisis is within our reach.
